

- 2023/24 budget: £336.6 million
- At Period 5 (August) we are projecting an £8m overspend
- Driven by an increase in demand of services in both Adults and Children's
- Reflects the macro-economics and the challenging employment market
- Currently developing the budget for 2024/25

Total expenditure: £336.59 million








Where the money comes from




