Some Basic Facts

- Every council must have an annual meeting (Local Government Act 1972, Schedule 12, paragraph 7)
- It must be held in May.
- In 2024 it can be on any day in May.
- In 2025, the year of ordinary elections, it must be held within 14 days of the day on which councillors come into office (advice will be given!)

Some Basic Facts

- The first item of business must be to elect a chair/mayor (Local Government Act 1972, Section 15(2)).
- The chair is elected as chair of the council (not of the meeting).
- The chair must sign a declaration of acceptance of office at the meeting (or if absent at or before the next meeting).



Hors d'Oeuvres of Business

- The meeting may conduct ordinary business.
- The meeting may review documents and policies.
