The Nuts & Bolts

- Local Elections take place on Thursday 1 May 2025.
- Every seat on every parish and town council in Northamptonshire is up for election that day.
- Both unitary councils have elections that day too.
- The close of nominations will likely be Thursday 3 April 2025.
- All councillors retire in May 2025 but may seek reelection (If they do, they must submit nomination papers by 3 April 2025).

The Nuts & Bolts

- If there are more candidates than seats, there will be a poll and the candidates with the most votes will be declared elected.
- If there are the same number of candidates or fewer, there will not be a poll and however many candidates there are will be declared elected uncontested.
- Contested / Uncontested but all elected.

Aims & Objectives

- For every parish and town council in Northamptonshire to have a strongly contested election.
- To increase diversity
- To ensure effective community governance
- To strengthen democracy
- To improve the image of the sector





Challenges

- Uncontested elections in 2021
- Volunteering has fallen dramatically since Covid
- Local Government Reorganisation & local government austerity
- Transfer of assets and services to parish and town councils
- Uncontested elections in 2023 in other counties
