You will need to be available to meet once a month and have time to receive and read various correspondence outside of these meetings. Councillors are not paid, but act in this role because they are passionate about the community and must abide by a local government code of conduct. Training to help you in your role is provided and paid for by the Council.

The Parish Council meets on the second Monday of the month (except August) in the Chelveston Village Hall. If you join a Working Party or become a Council representative on another body, then you will be expected to attend those meetings or events as well.
