Introduction

As a police liaison representative (PLR) for your council, you have a unique role in your community to help keep it safe, promote awareness of key issues, advise individuals on how to report crimes, as well as maintaining a strong and communicative relationship with your neighbourhood policing team (NPT).

This service guide outlines different information and services available to your communities. In this guide you are signposted to all the different channels you can use to contact a member of the police through, whether this by phone, online, or by visiting your local police station. It is important for everyone to note that there are services designed to make reporting simple and easy through non-English 999 and 999 BSL and sign video, so that everyone feels safe to report crime.

Our main communication platform, Northamptonshire Talking, is essential to keep up to date with crimes and issues in your area, learning what services your local policing team are providing, and also gives you access to contact each policing team directly.

Your role as a PLR is aiding the police significantly in accessing and understanding community concerns, so that we can continue to fight crime and protect people.

Contacting your neighbourhood team

As a PLR, your role is to liaise with and form relationships with your local Neighbourhood policing team, to help keep your communities safe. You will receive news and information from your team to share with your council, your town or parish. As liaison you will also reach out to your points of contact about crime issues or any concerns you may have..

Your point of contact will usually be a PCSO from your area, but you may also work with Police Officers and Sergeants from your neighbourhood team at different points throughout your role.

From 2025 we aim to send all PLR digital communications through our Northamptonshire Talking platform. In addition, we will now also be able to message specific groups of PLRs.

The platform allows two-way



communications so that will allow you to reply to messages and your emails will be shared and monitored to ensure prompt response times. You can find your neighbourhood team through this platform by entering your postcode on the home page, which will direct you to the relevant area. You will see all members of the team you can contact, local events in your area, and any crime prevention alerts.





Get involved in your community

There are many ways that you can get involved with the police through our community engagement schemes.

Emergency Service Cadets

Special Constables

Special Constables are our longest and most established volunteer role having existed since 1835! They are ordinary members of the public who volunteer to undertake the role and responsibilities of a Police Constable in their own time, volunteering alongside regular officers in a variety of roles from core policing teams of neighbourhood and response, through to specialist roles in rural crime, missing persons and even MOSOVO. Police Support Volunteers

Becoming a police support volunteer is an excellent opportunity to become involved with different aspects of policing. Volunteers on Horseback

Volunteers provide a link between their rural communities, the local policing teams and the rural crime team. Being on horseback they can cover large areas easily and see over hedges etc. They are available to assist in the location of missing persons, represent Northamptonshire Police at public events, and support area teams if required. On-call firefighter

Become an on-call firefighter and help to protect your local community. If you live within an eight-minute drive of your local fire station, then you can provide cover on top of your day job, during work hours, or in your spare time. You will be trained to help save lives and will be paid for being available and receive fees for any incidents you attend. Access more information <u>here</u>.





Street Watch

Street Watch enables local people to take an active role in keeping their community safe by patrolling their local area, identifying potential issues and engaging with local residents, encouraging them to report things like antisocial behaviour, vandalism and suspicious behaviour to the police. Street Watch volunteers are supported by a coordinator who liaises with team



members and their local neighbourhood policing team to share information and help progress any initiatives that can help prevent crime and improve safety in their local area. Neighbourhood Watch

Neighbourhood Watch is about people getting together with their neighbours to take action to reduce crime. They're community initiatives owned and run by their members which are supported by the police but not owned by them. They work by developing a close relationship between community members and the local police. You can find your local NW <u>here</u> or start a new scheme in your area.

PubWatch

PubWatch schemes are local, independent groups formed of people working in licensed premises. They often take part in safety and alcohol awareness campaigns to tackle and prevent ASB, promote safe drinking environments, and improve communication and sharing information between licensees. Community Speed Watch

Speed watch is a volunteer programme run by Northamptonshire Police in conjunction with the Northamptonshire Safer Roads Alliance, enabling local people to be actively involved in road safety and reducing speeding in their community. Speed monitoring runs between March and October. Drivers detected as speeding by CSW receive a police warning letter and their records are held for 12 months to identify any repeat offenders. Anyone detected three or more times will be visited by police officers. More information is available at **northants.police.uk/csw**





CarKraft

This is a driving experience designed to reduce the number of people killed and seriously injured on Northamptonshire's roads. The scheme is aimed at young, qualified drivers aged 17-30 and young non-drivers aged 15+. Neighbourhood crime

Antisocial behaviour (ASB)

Anti-social behaviour is any behaviour that causes or is likely to cause harassment, alarm or distress. This behaviour has many forms, from aggressive, noisy or abusive behaviour to neighbourhood disturbances involving drugs, abandoned cars or animals. Please report any concerns <u>here</u>.

Let's talk ASB

Anti-social behaviour can affect anyone. Don't suffer alone. Report ASB to the police or your local council.



Residential burglary

- Burglars often break in at the rear of properties, so it is important to ensure your rear garden is secure with a fence/wall/gate, and keep all gates locked.
- Keep your doors locked at all times and windows closed if you're not in the room.
- Making your house look occupied by leaving lights on and using timer switches helps to deter potential burglars.
- Neighbourhood Watch can offer support and advice for keeping your house safe, and also provide support to victims of burglary. More information available <u>here</u>.

- You can also report a burglary to the police online <u>here</u> or by calling 101, or 999 in an emergency.

Bike marking

Neighbourhood teams regularly hold bike marking events in locations around the county. Having a bike security marked is a highly effective visible deterrent to bike thieves. Tips to ensure your bike remains secure and safe can be found <u>here.</u>



Register your property

Immobilise can be used by members of the public and businesses to register their valued possessions. This online checking service is used thousands of times each day by UK police forces to trace owners of lost and stolen property. It also assists the police in investigating criminal activity involving stolen goods.

Road Safety

Road Safety Community Fund - OPFCC

Your local council can apply through the road safety fund from the OPFCC who can award grants of up to £5,000. This scheme is supported by the Northamptonshire Safer Roads Alliance. More information about this scheme is available <u>here</u>.

Report speeding

If you are concerned about speeding, you should contact with your local neighbourhood policing team via <u>Northamptonshire Talking</u>. You can also report driving offences <u>here</u>.

Submit dashcam footage

Under Op Snap, members of the public can submit dashcam footage online regarding road offences. The team can only accept footage within a 14-day window of the offence. This is because they only have 14 days to notify drivers of the offence.




Violence against women and girls (VAWG)

Domestic violence - Clare's Law

This scheme enables the police to release information about any previous history of violence or abuse a person might have. Under Clare's Law you can:

- Apply for information about your current or expartner because you're worried they may have a history of abuse and are a risk to you
- Request information about the current or ex-partner of a friend/relative because you're worried they might be a risk



This is called 'the right to ask'.

Support and advice for child safety

Child sex offender disclosure scheme -Sarah's Law

This scheme lets you formally ask the police whether someone who has contact with a child has a record for child sexual offences or poses a risk for some other reason. If you are worried about someone's behaviour towards a child or there is something you have seen, heard, or been told, you can use Sarah's Law to find out if that person is a risk. Child criminal exploitation

Child criminal exploitation is when someone uses a child (under 18 years old) to commit crimes for them. It includes things like forcing a child to work on a cannabis farm or targeting, grooming, coercing and exploiting a child to sell drugs in county lines operations.

Child sexual exploitation

Child sexual exploitation involves situations, contexts or relationships in which a person under 18 is given something, such as food, accommodation, drugs, alcohol, cigarettes, affection, gifts or money in return for performing sexual activities or having sexual activities performed on them. It can also involve violence, coercion and intimidation, with threats of physical harm or humiliation.

If you are worried that a child is being exploited, please report your concerns. You can report your concerns on 101 or 999 in an emergency. To report anonymously, you can contact <u>CrimeStoppers</u> on their website or by calling 0800 555 111. You can also contact the NSPCC on 0808 800 5000




Missing Persons

Herbert Protocol

This is a form that carers, family or friends of a vulnerable person, or the person themselves can fill in. It contains a list of information to help the police if the person goes missing. Keeping a completed form saves the worry of trying to recall the information during a stressful time if someone is missing.

Safe Haven Scheme

If the police find an elderly person who is lost or disorientated, they may ask the designated Safe Haven, Southfields Care Home, to allow them access. This is on a temporary basis until the elderly person can be reunited with their permanent carer/carers.

This system is in preference to accommodating the elderly person in a police station and forms a part of Northamptonshire Police Dementia Friendly initiative. The elderly person will be accompanied at all times by a police officer.



Safety Advice

Fraud and Cyber Crime

Action Fraud is the national reporting centre for fraud and cyber crime. They collect reports about fraud on behalf of the police. If you have been a victim of a scam, fraud, or online crime (cyber crime), you can report it to Action Fraud via their website <u>www.actionfraud.police.uk</u> or by calling them on 0300 123 2040.

Knife bins

To help reduce the number of knives and weapons on the street, orange knife amnesty bins have been placed around the county to allow the public to dispose of any knives safely and anonymously. You can find the locations of the bins <u>here</u>. Young people can access help and support, and report anonymously, via <u>Fearless</u>. You can also report information about knife crime anonymously via <u>CrimeStoppers</u> or by calling 0800 555 111.




Refuge
