


Launching North Northamptonshire Council

Investment in North Northamptonshire



- £19.9 million Town Fund monies for Corby town centre
- Kettering's £3.5million Heritage Action Zone project started (GLAM)
- Secured £447,000 to support local high streets and town centres
- Announced a new primary school at Stanton Cross, Wellingborough
- Refurbished six play areas in Wellingborough



Progressed Service Delivery



- Maintained continuity of service provision (key priority was safe and legal)
- Safely reopened libraries, leisure centres and customer service centres
- Good progress with important services such as Children's Services



Supported Business, Economy and Communities







- Secured £3m 'top-up' funding to support businesses impacted by COVID-19
- Launched a 'Go Northamptonshire' tourism campaign to promote the area this summer and autumn (Social Media campaign)
- Business support services packages provided by the Council



Engaged Local Communities







- Delivered a range of public consultations on important local issues
- Engaged School Children to name a road sweeper 'Sweepasaurus'
- Helped organise wellbeing festivals and family fun days for local communities



Tough on Enforcement







- Executive agreed a strategy for tackling litter and fly-tipping
- The Council has carried out a number of prosecutions
- Executive agreed a singular enforcement policy for the area



Climate Change and the Environment



- Environmental considerations central to the Council's future plan
- Secured £240,000 Forestry Commission grant to plant over 1,000 trees!
- Confirmed seven sites for installation of electric vehicle charging points with further sites in development

- Progressing the Active Travel Scheme across the area and new Bus Strategy

It really doesn't seem long ago since I sat down to write my last update. Time feels like it is going so fast. Before I know it, I will be promoting Christmas events across the area!



Objectives (Slide 1)

 - Do things better than what went before
 - Dispel some myths on what this new council will do to Parishes & Town Councils

Strategic Town and Parish Forum

- 2 forums are being set up, one for Kettering & Corby, one for East Northants & Wellingborough
- Will meet at least twice per year

 Will enable NNC to share key strategic updates and for us to collectively discuss cross cutting themes & issues as equal partners



Single Point of Contact (SPOC)

- Full contact list for key officers has been circulated to Clerks
- A SPOC will be provided for both 'Housing & Communities' and 'Place & Economy'. Each T&P will have a named officer to help with day-to-day communication
- The SPOCs will be in regular dialogue with Clerks based on arrangements that suit each Local Council



How can you help?

- Share community intelligence with us through SPOC
- Be a conduit for a dialogue with local communities
- Work collaboratively with one another
- Share, where possible, the information we issue
- Mutual understanding that there will be challenges
