Sustainability

"Meeting the needs of the present without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their own needs."

United Nations Brundtland Commission 1987

Sustainability is not just about climate change, it covers environmental, social and economic factors which together form the three pillars of sustainability. Many of the issues we face personally, and within our communities, fall into these three categories.







Framework for Sustainability

- The Council needed a **structured framework** for sustainability which would provide focus and against which, we could measure achievements
- Looked at best practice, nationally and at a local level, the University of Northampton being a good local example
- The decision was taken to use the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) as a framework for sustainability
- The current set of SDGs were adopted by the UN in September 2015 and will be due for review in 2030
- The UK Government is committed to delivery of the SDGs, and publishes a Voluntary National Review to report on progress, <u>UK Gov UN SDGs</u>





UN Sustainable Development Goals

The current UN SDGs includes 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) along with 169 associated targets.

Work was undertaken to map the SDGs against current WNC priorities and activities.

- The group has been meeting every 2 months and have been involved at all stages of the work to set the direction of the sustainability project





Strategy

- The strategy was launched on the 28th March 2022 and is intended to deliver sustainability across West Northamptonshire
- Well received by stakeholders and external organisations
- Has generated ongoing engagement with local groups, parish councils and individuals
- In conjunction with the strategy the Council announced three Foundation Pledges;
 - Net Zero own emissions by 2030 and those of residents and businesses by 2045.
 - Take a community leadership role for Sustainability in West Northants.
 - Ensure all our Council strategies and policies are aligned to and contribute to the delivery of the UN SDGs.





Workplan

- Through a consultation exercise with members we developed a draft workplan
- No suggestion off the table, this was to ensure proposals were ambitious
- We looked at best practice including other authorities, the Friends of the Earth climate action plan, and public sector organisations
- Proposals were categorised into service areas
- The workplan will be mapped against the UN SDGs





Net Zero

- Net Zero means cutting greenhouse gas emissions to as close to zero as possible
- Greenhouse gases that cannot be eliminated are **offset by forestry or technologies** that remove these emissions from the atmosphere
- WNC will account and report on key greenhouse gases carbon dioxide (CO2), methane (CH4), nitrous oxide (N2O), hydrofluorocarbons (HFCs), perfluorocarbons (PCFs), sulphur hexafluoride (SF6) and nitrogen trifluoride (NF3), expressed as CO2e
- Carbon dioxide (CO2) is the primary greenhouse gas produced by human activity such as from the energy supply system, burning of fuels in homes and businesses; use of fuels in the transport system; agriculture; industrial processes, waste management and land use





Drivers

- Achievement of Net Zero is a core deliverable of the West Northamptonshire Council Sustainability Strategy
 - West Northamptonshire Council to be Net Zero by 2030 and
 - West Northants residents and businesses to be Net Zero by 2045
- West Northamptonshire Council has signed the **UK100 Net Zero Pledge** as a foundation of its Sustainability Strategy
- Progress towards Net Zero will generate **economic, social and environmental benefits** for residents of and visitors to West Northamptonshire
- Net Zero contributes to UN Sustainable Development Goal 13: Take Urgent Action to Combat Climate Change and Its Impacts
- The Climate Change Act 2008 requires the UK to be Net Zero by 2050

Planning for Net Zero

- Establishment of a West Northamptonshire Net Zero Programme:
 - West Northamptonshire Council Net Zero by 2030
 - West Northamptonshire Net Zero by 2045
 - Work in progress:
 - Setting up programme governance
 - Baselining WNC emissions; constructing a pipeline of WNC Net Zero activity; beginning to identify offsetting requirements
 - Designing and building a Net Zero monitoring and reporting framework





Good for the Economy

- The global catalytic converter market was estimated to be worth £12 million in 2021, and it is expected to reach £24 million revenue by 2030, advancing at a <u>compound annual</u> <u>growth rate of 8.0% during 2021–2030</u>. This market development has been primarily driven through stringent mandated tailpipe emissions standards
- By increasing the charge for plastic bags to 10p the Government's scheme is expected to benefit the UK by
 - an expected overall benefit of over £331 million to the UK economy
 - an overall reduction of 21% in the number of carrier bags supplied across all bag types (single-use carrier bags, bags for life, paper bags, cotton tote bags and bin liners)
 - reduce the number of single-use carrier bags issued by small and medium retailers by 80%

- Intended for public release
- Developing a comms plan to ensure release of the report is well supported
- Intended to show evidence of transparency
- Peer review, with partners such as NPH, NHS
- Intention to inform stakeholders such as CA-WN in advance of the publication
